

POULTRY FARM

Over a quarter of a million hens are kept at the poultry farms of the "Krasny Klyuch" State Farm in Tataria. The poultry complex is fully mechanized and automated. A special TV camera allows to keep a constant eye on all the twelve halls of the complex. The change of poultry farming to an industrial basis is a major reserve for the increase of the effectivity of production, of making the produce cheaper. The control of all the processes, from feeding to collecting eggs is carried out from the dispatcher control board. This poultry farm in Tataria is aiming to sell the state 60 million eggs in the fourth year of the five year plan.

ATHLETICS

Indoor athletics competitions between the teams of USA and the Soviet Union were held in Moscow at the Indoor Brother Znamensky Stadium. Four athletes - two from each country - competed in each event. 60 m. running for women. Marta Watson from the US crossed the finish line a moment ahead of others. In the high jumps the US left the struggle for victory at 2,10 m. Soviet athlete Kostius Shapka jumped 2,15 m. - his result was second best. His team-mate Sergei Sudalov achieved a personal record by jumping 2,23 m. In the 60 m. running for men victory went to Clifford Gutlin from the US. His result was 6,4 sec. In the triple jump winners were Soviet et jumpers - Olympics Champion Victor Saneyev and Mikhail Bariban. Nadeshda Chishova set a world record in shot put - her result was 20,40 m. The competitions of Soviet and American athletes resulted in the victory of Soviet athletes by 34 points.

TALKS BETWEEN L. BREZHNEV, A. GROMYKO AND HENRY KISSINGER

Leonid Brezhnev, General Secretary of the CC of the CPSU, had talks in Kremlin with Henry Kissinger, US Secretary of State and Presidential adviser.
